Since the start of CFO delivery

3,621

veterans have accessed CFO3 and CFO Activity Hubs



99% of veterans engaging with CFO are male.

The most prominent issue for veterans on CFO centred around a loss of identity.

Leaving the forces can impact on identity, which can be amplified by going to prison. Losing connections with family and friends, having to re-train for a different career and poor mental health and wellbeing are aggravating factors.

CFO support veterans in overcoming these barriers to rehabilitation.
