As a cohort, young people are significantly more likely to report having only GSCE-level, or no formal qualifications. They are less likely know how to complete a job application, or how to write a CV, making employability a key barrier to overcome.

Compared to those above 25 years of age, young people are:



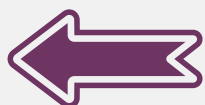
62% more likely to have been involved in gang activity

56% less likely to report that they don't want a job



50% more likely to be from an ethnic minority background

23% more likely to be actively looking for work



34% of young people engage with education and training, which is **8%** higher than those over 25 years of age
